Satya no puede quedarse quieto.


Corre y salta y gira y rueda ...

Satya **salta** como una liebre y **corre** como un ciervo.


"El barro es blando, ¡ten cuidado!" Dice Amma.

¡Cuidado con las espinas! Dice Amma.






Se **balancea** como una araña y **salta** como un chimpancé.

Sube como un lagarto y **salta** como una cabra.


"¡No te resbales!" Dice Amma.

¡Descubre cómo se mueven algunas de estas criaturas!






Los delfines son famosos por saltar fuera del agua. ¿Puedes **saltar** ?
