Scarpered sc-ar-pur-d The goat scarpered when the laughing hyena suddenly appeared.


Puny **p-yew-nee** *The goat had puny legs but a firm head.*

The other animals shouted at Gerald to be quiet.





"Ha!" shouted Gerald. "I'm a tough and fast goat. There's no way you can catch me!"





"You don't belong out here," said the bull. "You're a goat. You should be back at the farm with your water. This area is far too dangerous for you to live in."


"Ha!" said Gerald. "I'm a tough, resilient goat! I can outlast hot weather. All I had was a little accident and I won't let that stop me!"

...when suddenly a hyena came out of nowhere and scared the sheep and Gerald away.


"Get off my land! Ha! Ha! Ha! Hoo! Hoo!" said the hyena, licking his lips. "I eat goats for breakfast!"
