

"Hello," said Jeanie, opening her front door to find a stray dog standing outside.


"You must have followed me home from school."




Jeanie ran to the woods and picked some pretty colourful flowers to bring for her grandmother. Then she went looking for the dog. He had disappeared.

"Thank you for the flowers," said grandmother. "Have you had a good time?"


"I had a great time, grandmother," said Jeanie. "But I haven't finished playing yet."
