








"¡Buenas noches Dia! ¡Buenas noches Tara!" Dice Dada apagando la luz.






"¡ Monstruo!"

"¿ Qué vamos a hacer ?" pregunta Dia.




"Vamos a espantarlo, " dice Tara.

"Con un monstruo de nuestro propio," dice Dia.


"¡ El manta--dor !"

"Pienso que lo asustamos," dice Tara.


"Ay.. no, ¡Se está levantando!" esconde Dia..

"¿ Dónde está la linterna ?" pregunta Tara.


Dia apunta a las luces de la calle.




"Yo usaré la linterna para hacer un silla-uro con mi impermeable," dice Dia.


"Dos monstruos deban espantarlo," dice Tara.

### Observación de sombras.

Cuando la luz brilla sobre un objeto sólido, crea una forma oscura detrás de él. Esta forma oscura se llama una sombra.

Las sombras cambian en función de la luz. Si la luz está cerca del objeto, la sombra es más grande. Si la luz está lejos del objeto, la sombra es más pequeña. ¡ El mismo objeto puede proyectar dos sombras si brillas más de una luz sobre él !

Diferentes objetos hacen diferentes tipos de sombras. Intente hacer sombras con objetos hechos de cosas diferentes. Ilumine una linterna en un vaso de agua, un libro o una red y mire cómo cambian las sombras.
