

Olas en el mar, olas en su pelo. Hongos en el tronco de un árbol, pájaros en el cielo.




Palabras en un libro, que pueden transportarla a muchos lugares, lleno de nuevos colores, nuevas historias, y personajes.



Cosas del color que a ella más le gusta - rojo! Los tres pelos locos en la cabeza de su hermano Toto.




Confites en la torta, que su papi horneó, como las brillantes estrellas, que desde lejos saludó.
