



El abuelo Boun usó una red de pesca para atrapar un bagre de cola roja asiática.




Thao Kood pescó con redes de enmalle y capturó cangrejos de lodo.

El tío Khampiew usó una trampa y atrapó el bagre.




Tía Khamsouk fue a pescar y atrapó un bagre de cabeza ancha.
