“I could **stir**.”

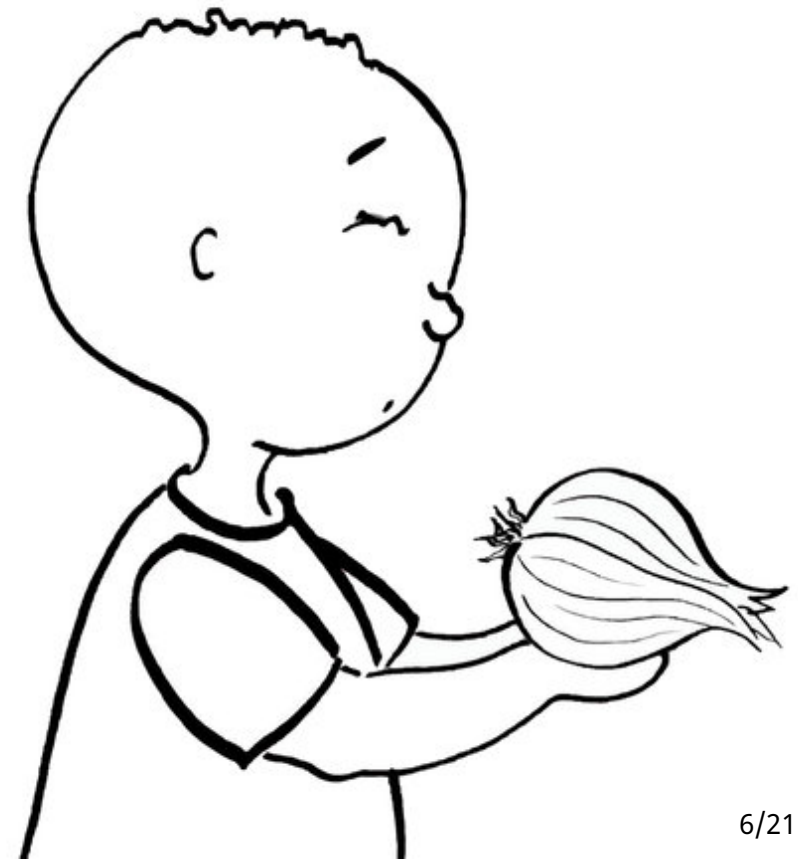


“You are still a bit **short**,” said Mama.

“The **pot** might fall over. But you can help me by **fetching** things.”

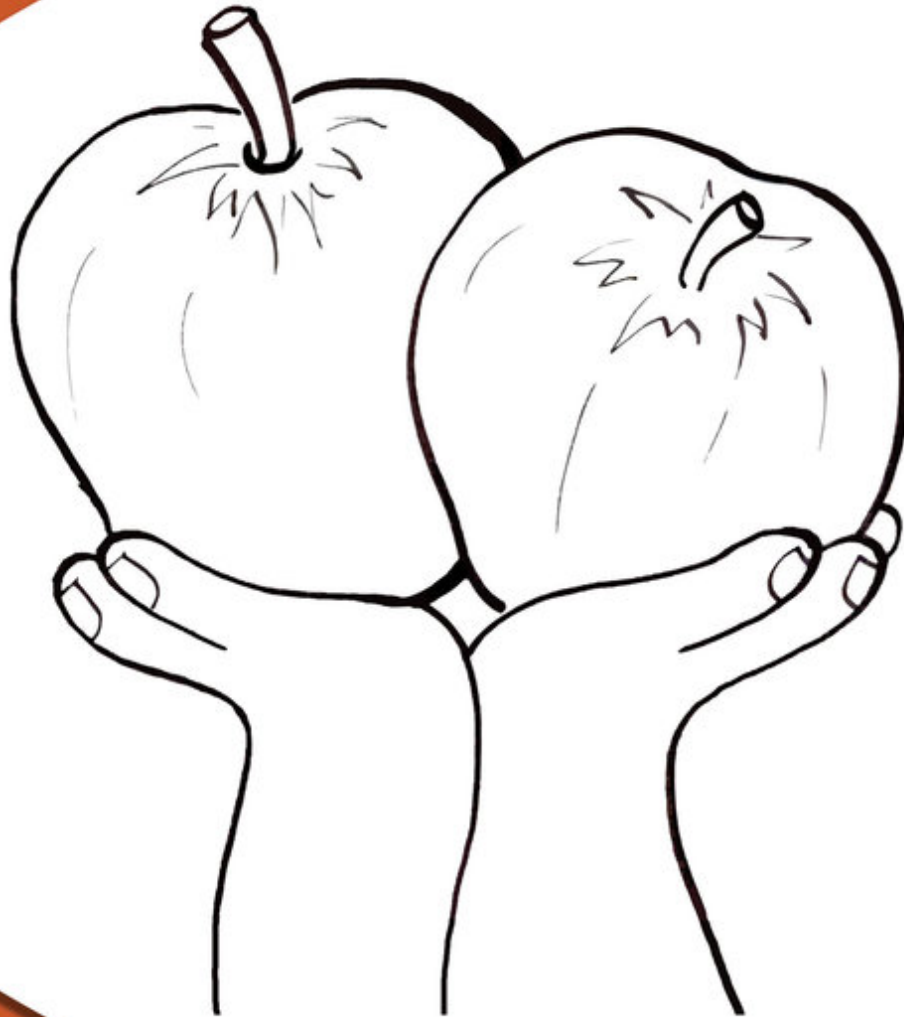
“Can you bring me an **onion**, please.”

“They will **taste** nice once they are **cooked.**”



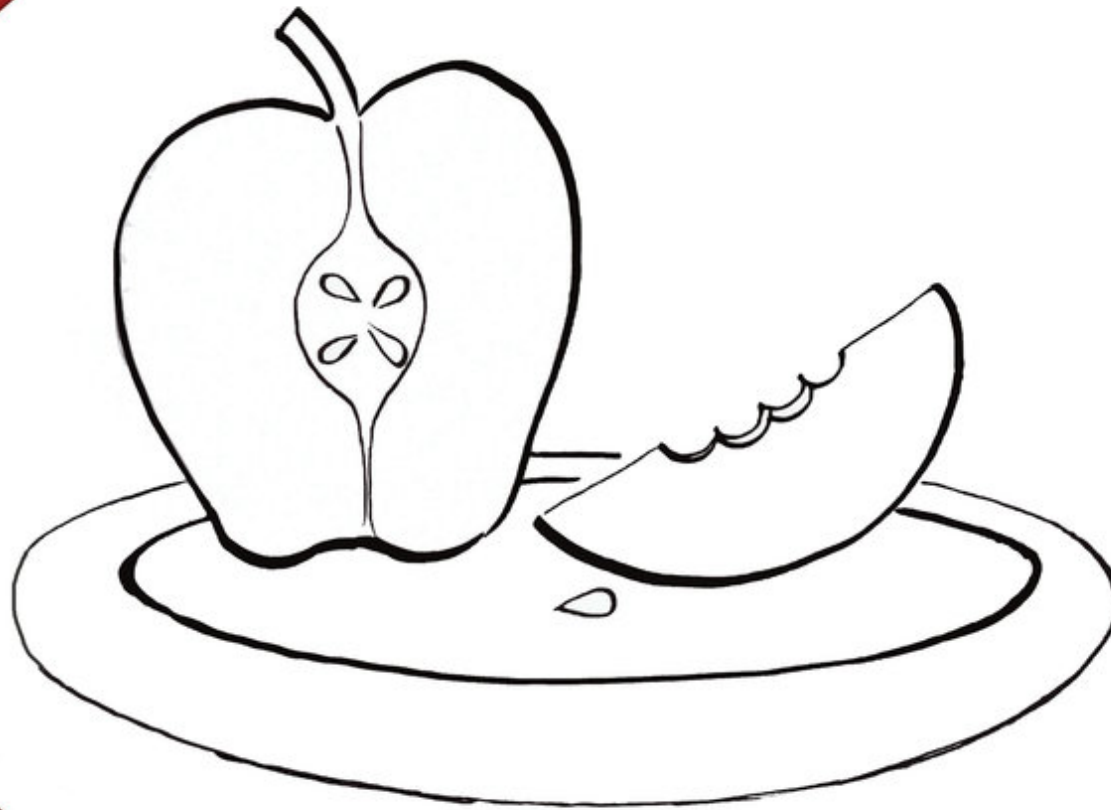
“Now I need some **tomatoes**. No, that is an **apple**.”

The tomatoes are also round and red, but you will find them in the fridge.”

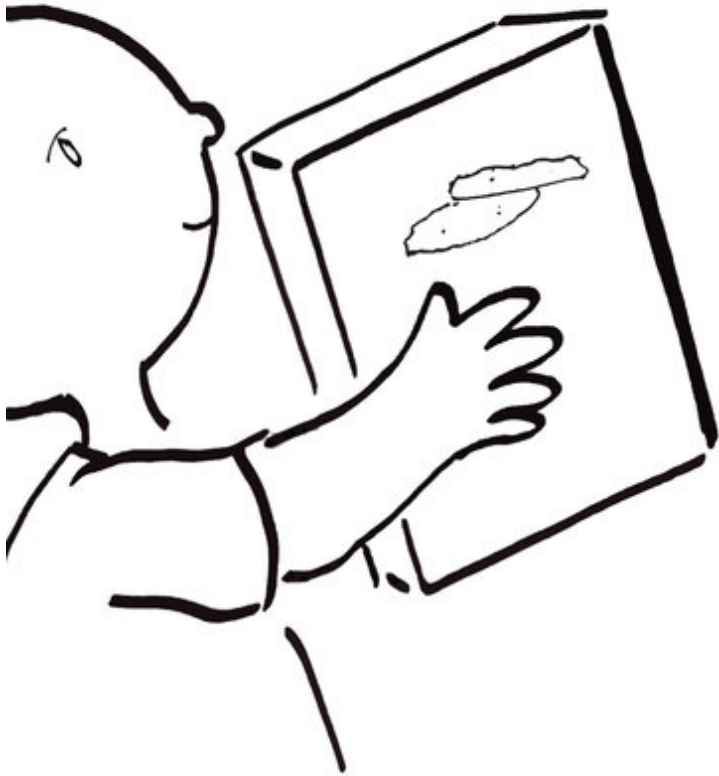
“Can you bring me **potatoes**.

“It’s a **surprise**. Wait and see.”

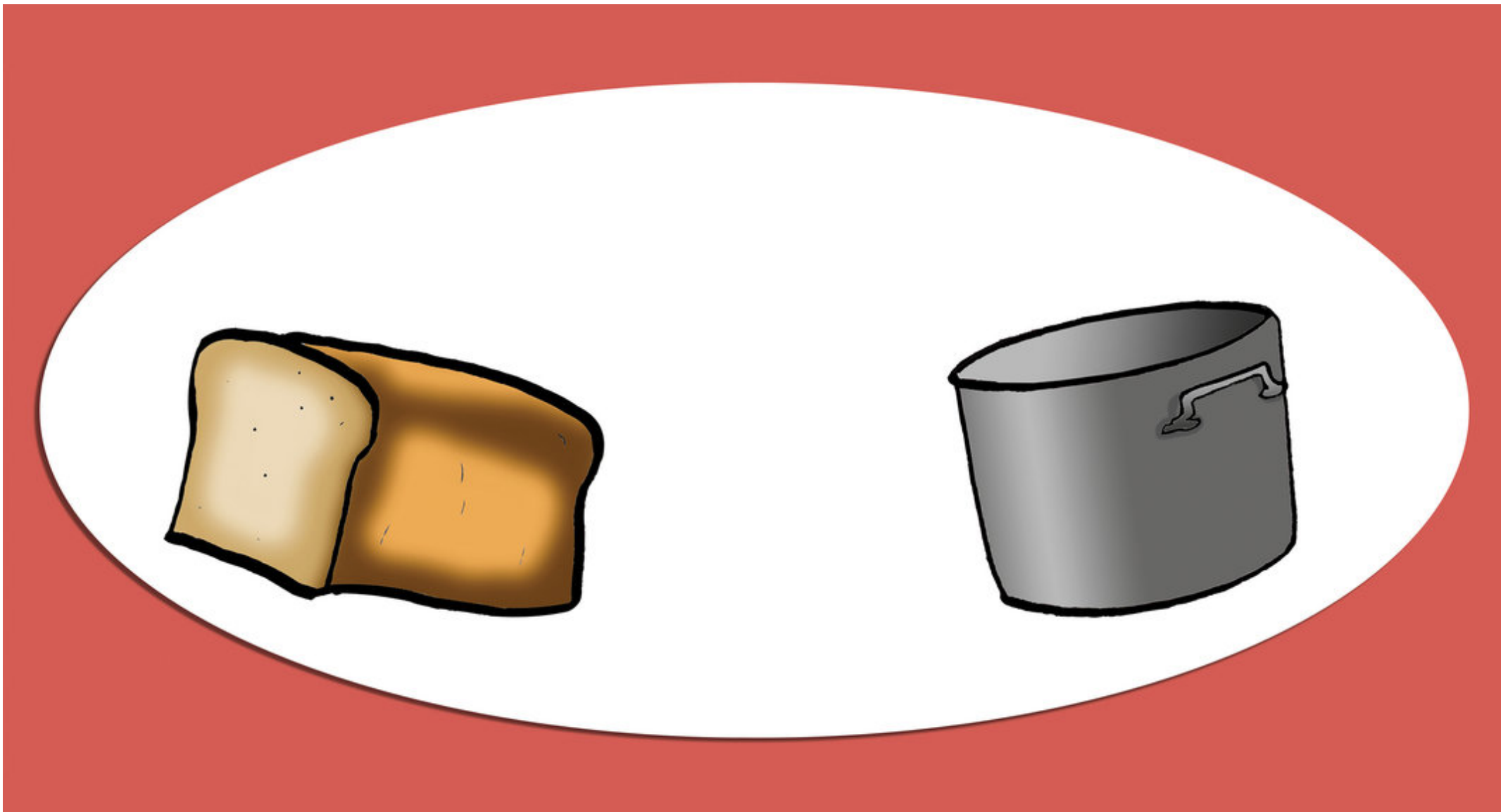
“What about **this?**”

It is also **green**.”





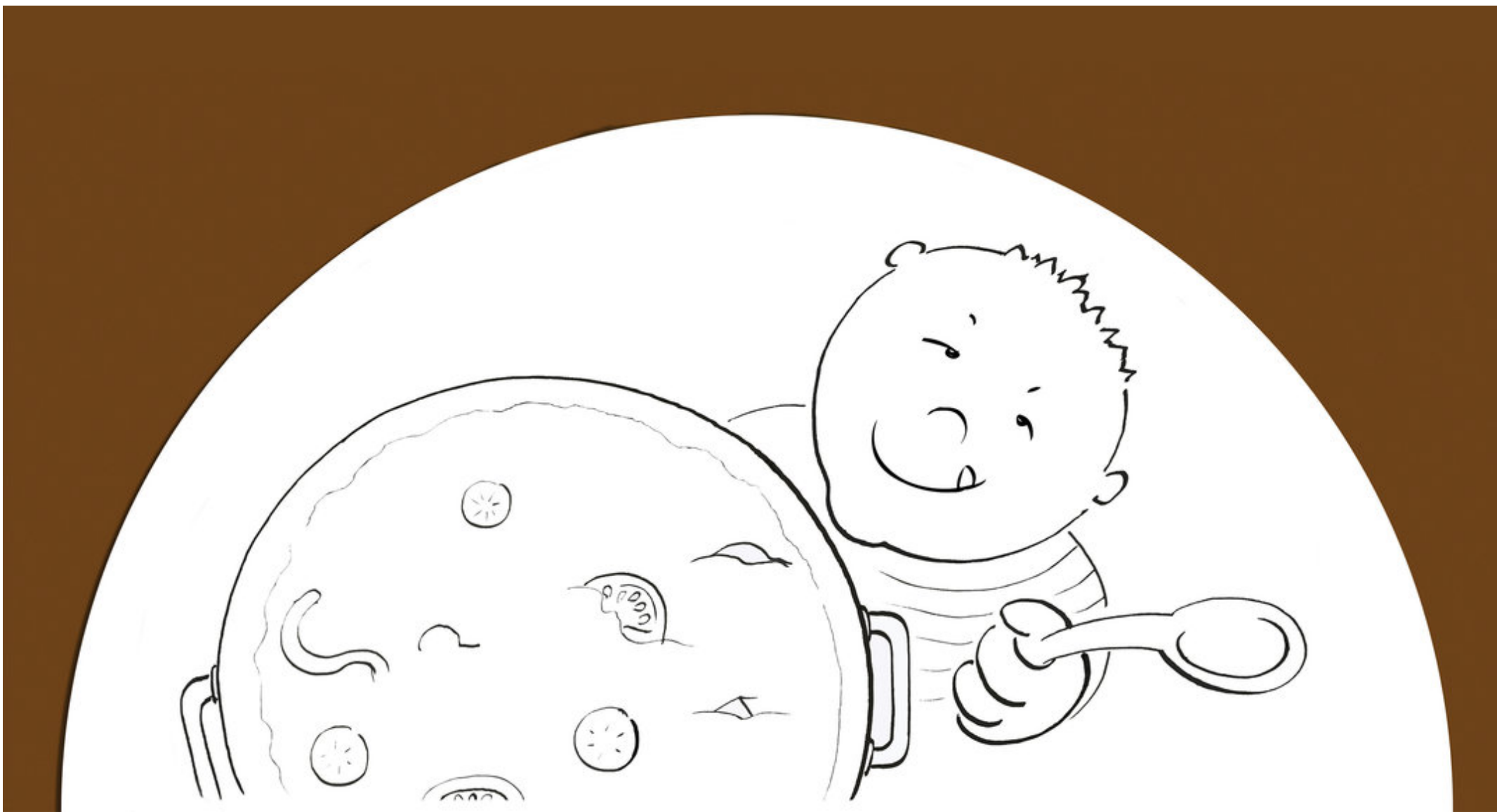
“Please get some **bread**.

No, it won't go into the **pot** but on the **table**.”

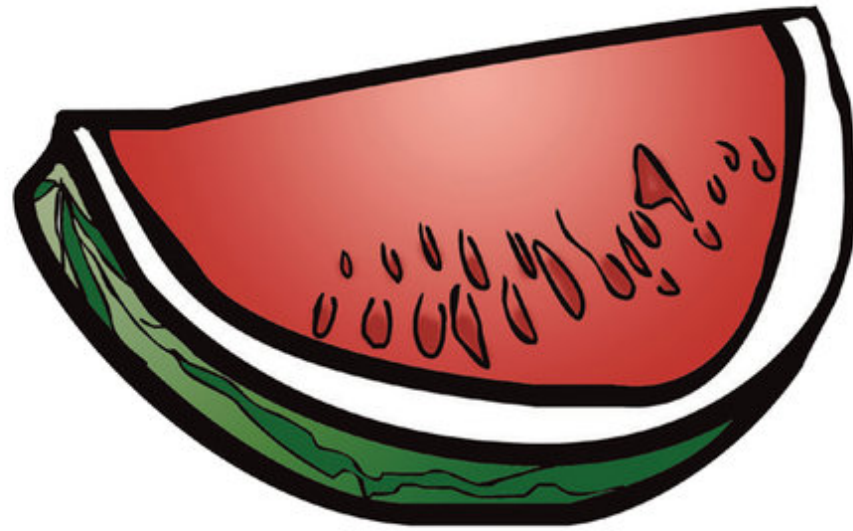


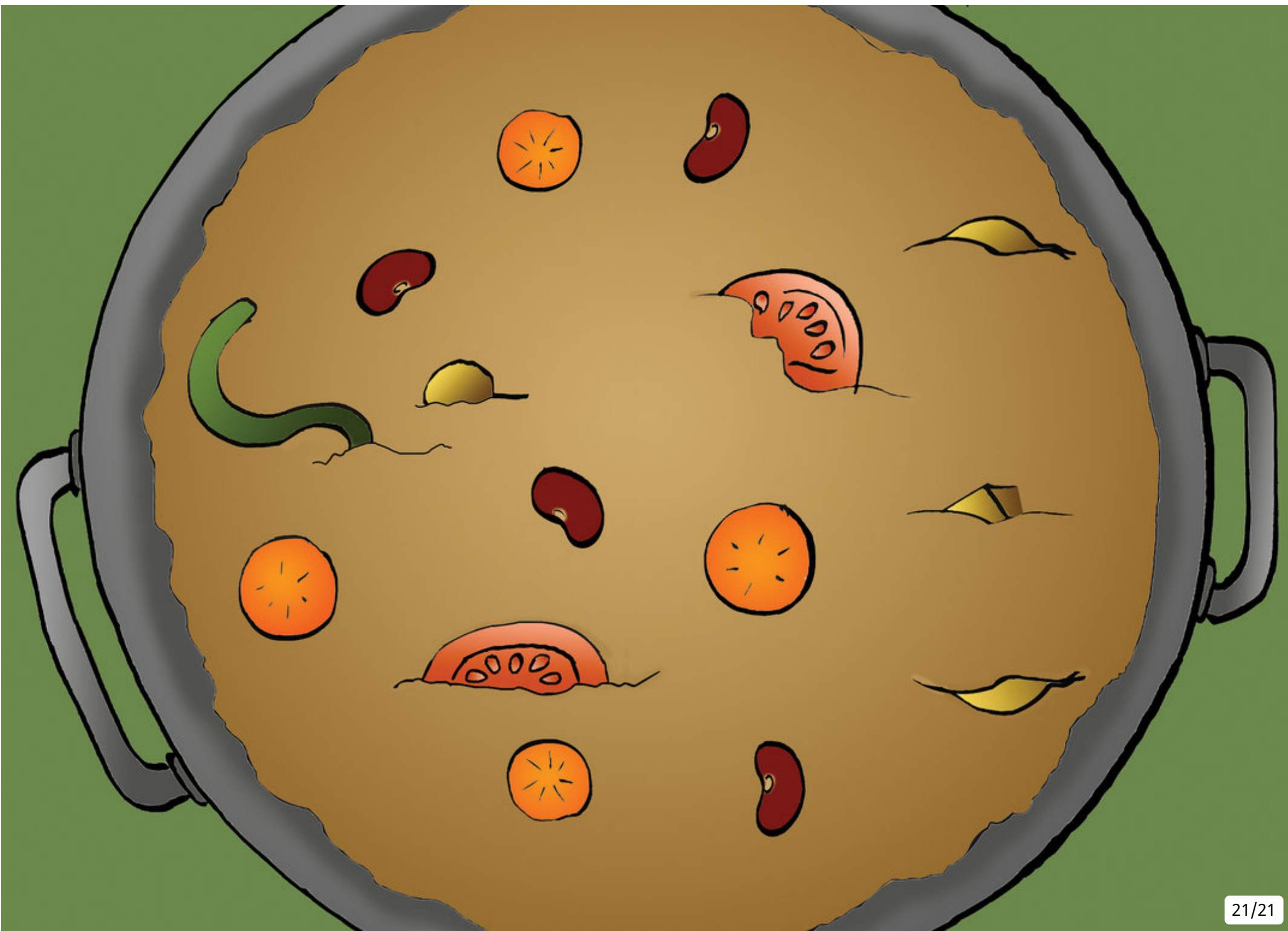
Mama carried the **pot** to the table and started to dish up.

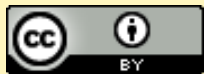
