Nang Khambai fished with a fishing cage and caught a silver barb.




Nang Bouakhao's fishing net caught shrimp.

Uncle Khampiew used a trap and caught catfish.




Aunt Khamsouk went spin fishing and caught a broadhead walking catfish.
