"Toffees?"


"¡No! ¡Dije que no! "Nina niega con la cabeza.

Nina se ríe y se une. "Veo algo azul""¡El cielo!" Dice Madre .




"Veo algo marrón", dice mamá.

"¡Una vaca!" Dice Nina.




"Veo algo verde", dice Nina.
