Al día siguiente después de la escuela, mi madre me dió una nueva gorra roja. "La luna lo envió ", ella dijo.

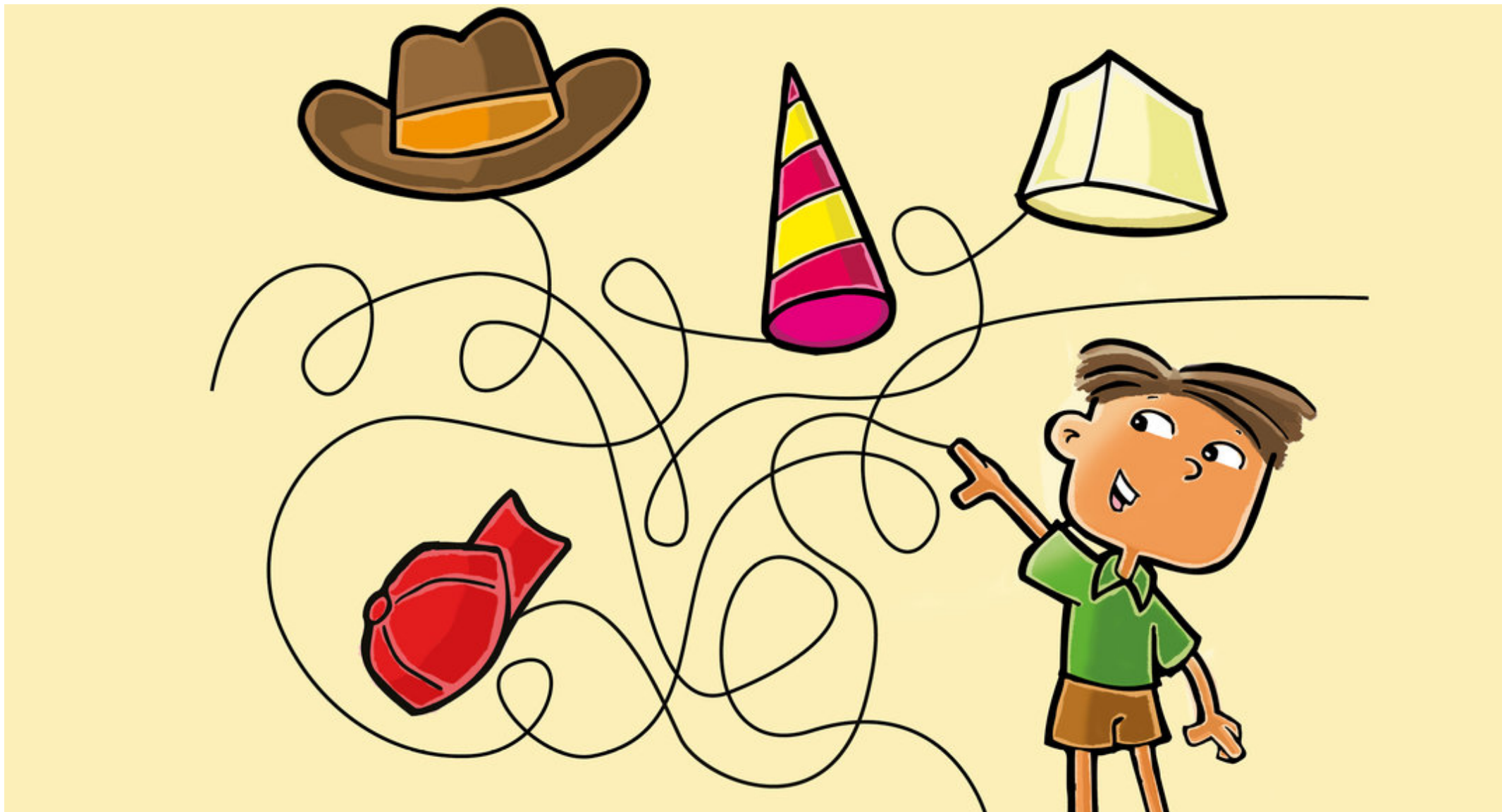


Esa noche, tanto la luna como yo llevamos nuestras gorras y sonreímos. Éramos felices.

Adivina qué gorra estoy usando hoy!

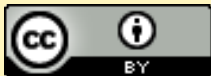

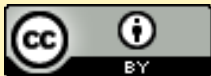
