One day, the sun felt so hot! It accidentally burned the moon. The moon thought it was deliberate so it got mad!




The moon ran away and the sun was so sad.

All the animals tried to comfort the sun but the sun didn't stop crying.




The moon hid behind the biggest stars so that the sun wouldn't find it. The moon lost a part of itself because of how the sun burned him.




The sun asked the fish in the oceans for help, but they said they can only see the moon at night hiding behind stars.
