Hamid is sadder.



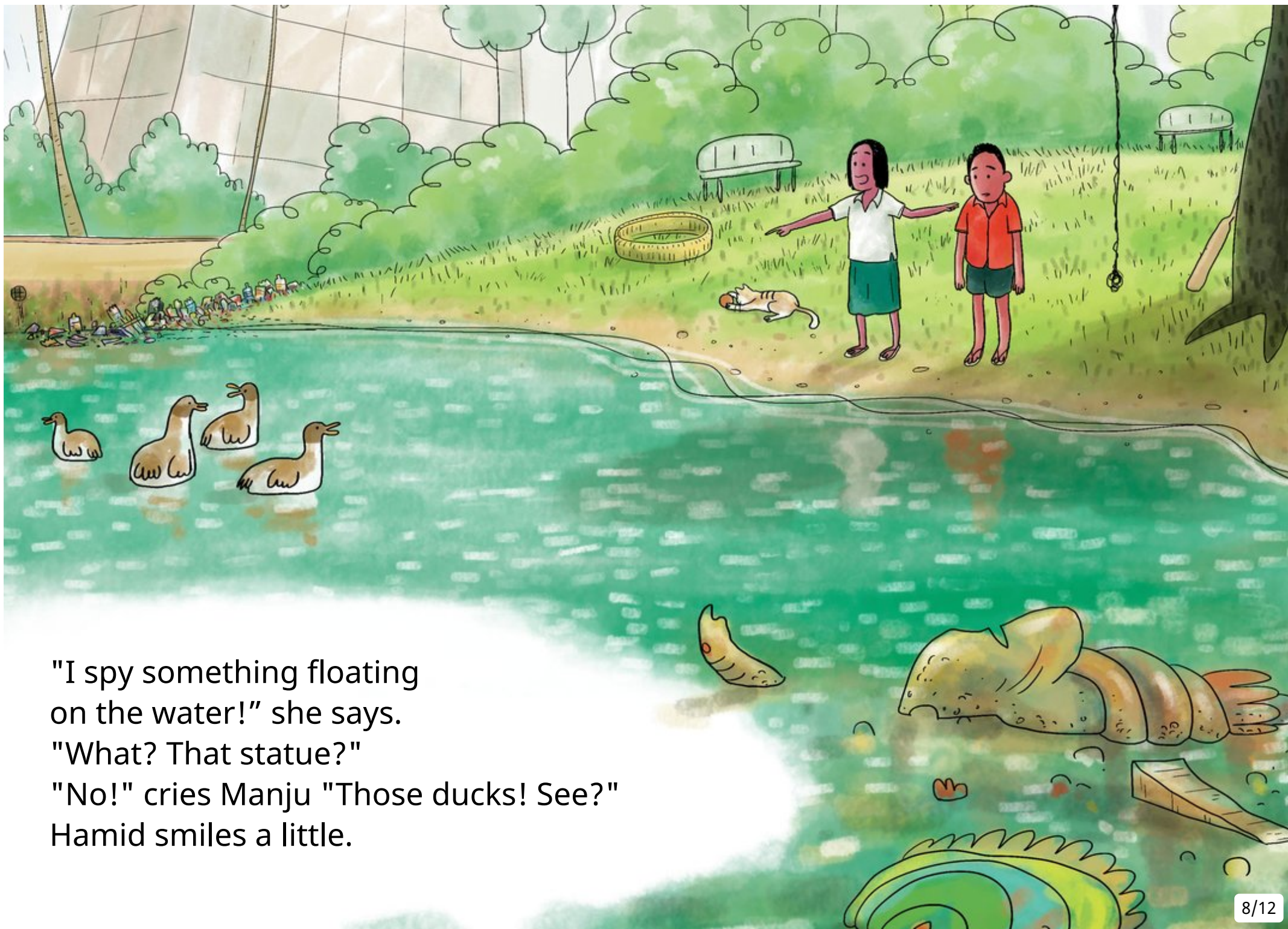
"I spy something white!" says Manju.
