







En la parte sur del río, abunda una planta llamada lirio acuático.




Nep sabe que el lirio acuático tiene flores moradas.

Sabe que usar el lirio para jugar a la casita es muy divertido.



Pero Nep no sabe por qué mamá corta sus tallos y hojas...




...y los seca.

Más tarde, mamá le da un par de sandalias tejidas con el lirio.


Ahora entiende Nep.
