

For the first time, he felt alive.




There was a lion that lived in a zoo. The people would stare at and tease him.

The lion was tired of being mistreated. He wanted to leave and find a new home.




One day there was torrential rain and everyone ran for cover. Most people went home from the zoo.

The lion felt the depth of the water around his enclosure. He could not feel the bottom. He was desperate to escape, but he did not know if he could make it out.





He ran as fast as he could through the zoo, determined not to be captured.




He walked past several enclosures, including the bear's cage. He saw a bear relaxing, and the bear was not surprised to see the lion.

"Listen carefully to me," said the bear. " Don't think you'll escape from this zoo. Wherever you go, they'll find you."



His presence scared them a little, but once they realised the lion was peaceful, they relaxed.




"They treated you very badly in that zoo," said one of the boys. "You deserve a new home. Stay with us anytime."
